David Slater has been studying and analysing John Browne's Master-Key. Much of this Master-Key is written in cipher. The cipher basically consists of substituting vowels, including "y" even when it is not being used as a vowel, with other letters. In the 1798 edition, {a,e,i,o,u,v} \rightarrow {b,r,o,w,n,e} is the transposition used. For the expanded 1802 edition, this transposition is again used, as well as $\{a,e,i,o,u,v\} \rightarrow \{k,c,o,l,n,u\}$, that is, four of the six vowels have two possible transpositions. The general rule seems to be that only one of these transpositions is used when ciphering a word, or indeed a sentence, although there are exceptions. After completing the exercise below, see if you can see some significance in when each set of transpositions is used. More will be said about this at the presentation on 10 August. Not all vowels are transposed. In the 1802 edition, upper case letters are ignored, which is not the case in the 1798 edition. Browne uses the long s (f) as well as the short s. Also, single letters can be doubled and doubled letters reduced to one letter. Some statistical analysis has been done to try to ascertain whether or not this is deliberate. Some abbreviations are used, such as "b" for "Brother" "bn" for "brethren", "rwm" for "Right Worshipful Master" and, in the 1798 edition, even "!" for "Mason" or "Masonry". Sometimes letters are omitted or added and others swapped, both within and across words, but this could be a result of the difficulty of proof reading a ciphered work. And, to make matters more interesting, there are some errors.

So, with these comments in mind, to gain some idea of what is involved have a go at deciphering the following extract from the 1802 edition of Browne's Master-Key, which has something to do with a Mason's son and includes how David hopes to be treated now that he is am approaching his 60th birthday anniversary.

The importance of Brown's Master-Key to research into masonic ritual will also be considered, together with some comparisons with other sources. The emphasis will be on the First Degree, so all masons are encouraged to attend. As an incentive, those who attend will be given a draft copy of the First Degree contents of Browne's Masonic Master-Key, deciphered and converted to current masonic spelling. If you decipher the passage above, you may even receive a signed copy!

RW Bro Bob Nairn gave an interesting and informative summary of his time at the 2011 International Conference on the History of Freemasonry, which was held at the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia, in May. 

THE SPEAKER - RW BRO RODNEY GROSSKOPFF

Rodney Grosskopff, who is 70 years old, was born in Johannesburg, has a diploma in architecture from the University of Witwatersrand and has recently retired as a senior partner in the architecture firm of Manfred Hermer (Johannesburg). He states that "Freemasonry has been an important part in most of my life" and he has held the office of Assistant District Grand Master for the district of South Africa North as well as being invested as a Past Senior Grand Deacon (UGLE). He has written numerous research papers for the Lyceum Lodge of Research No. 8682 EC (Johannesburg) of which he is a Past Master. He has published a book Carved in Stone (2010) about the Lodge of Good Hope (de Goede Hoop), in Cape Town, South Africa, and its sequel Carved in Gold (2011). He has also written a book entitled Bushveld Brethren which will be available for purchase on the evening of his talk to us, at a price of \$20. It is a collection of the research papers from which the various lodges can choose for presentation during his 2011 tour. Rodney has also written plays, travel features and children's stories for SABC-TV. He has held solo art exhibitions for his paintings, etchings and sculptures. He was a guest lecturer at the Eighth ANZMRC Conference held in Queanbeyan in 2008 when he spoke on the Masonic Presidents of the Orange Free State. RW Bro Grosskopff is an experienced and accomplished speaker who will entertain as well as inform when he speaks to us on Thursday, 22 September.

THE TALK - THE JAMESON RAID

The paper that RW Bro Rodney Grosskopff is to present on Thursday, 22 September has never been previously presented nor published before Rodney's present tour. It is an intriguing story of the attempted coup d'état by 'The Reform Committee', a group of mining magnates, business and professional men. Four of the five ringleaders were Freemasons and were sentenced to death. Many of the 'committee' were also masons, including the District Grand Master, with many of them banned or heavily fined. The Jameson Raid has been variously described as

- A comic opera. There are certainly elements of buffoonery in it.
- A major factor in the start of the Anglo-Boer war. In 1906 Jan Smuts said "The
 Jameson Raid was the real declaration of war in the great Anglo-Boer conflict ... And
 that is so, in spite of the four years truce that followed (the) aggressors consolidated
 their alliance, the defenders on the other hand silently and grimly prepared for the
 inevitable".
- As a most damaging diplomatic blunder to the British Empire. Winston Churchill later remarked "I date the beginning of these violent times (the 1914-1918 war) in our country from the Jameson Raid".

OUR AUGUST MEETING



The Lodge meets on the **second Wednesday** of February, April, May, July, August, October and November. All Masons are welcome; dress is neat casual with no regalia.

The work for the evening will be a presentation by Bro Philip Purcell entitled "Mathematical Foundations of the Masonic-Mind", and subtitled "There are no ultimate answers, only better questions". Philip asks to what extent has Freemasonry transcended the materialistic versus a model driven by the need for meta-knowledge, where meta-knowledge can be defined as being "knowledge of knowledge".

Philip's high level purpose is to research the transformative potential for humanity in the freedom of meta-knowledge through the intersection of mathematics with the theory of symbolism and its education, depicted as a masonic tracing board.

Philip's research is multi-disciplinary, being grounded in theoretical mathematics, geography, philosophy, economics, sociology, network theory, ancient history and Freemasonry. He proposes that Freemasonry can be more than a genteel social club of high moral standards with geometric analogues grafted onto the ritual to convey these standards. His purpose is to theorise the masonic-mind and to educate masons and the general population to realise the diminishing returns that can be obtained from material wealth, or from its uneven distribution.

Philip will give a further talk at the Masonic Study Circle's meeting on Friday, 28 October, where Philip's focus will be different from the talk that he will give at the Linford Lodge of Research. The focus will be towards the theory behind the spiritual content. The method of leveraging that content is by referencing circumstantial connections that Walter Wilmshurst may have had with advanced mathematics, and whether this could have influenced his work that was still in progress when he died, *the Tracing Board of the Centre*.

The Masonic Study Circle usually meets on the fourth Fridays of the odd months of the year (i.e. January, March, May, July, September and November). However, this year the September meeting was postponed to October. It meets at the home of Bro Geoff Driscoll, 38 Inkster Street, Kambah. The meeting starts at 7.30 pm although, if you would like to partake of a meal before the meeting, usually pizzas and accompanying drinks, then arrive at 7 pm. All are invited to attend.

OUR SEPTEMBER MEETING



NOTICE OF MOTIONS TO ALTER THE BY-LAWS

According to our by-laws, a Special General Meeting has to be convened to consider any rescinding, amending or altering of clauses of our by-laws and then has to be carried by two-thirds of the members present at this convened Special General Meeting. The changes shall not become effective until they have been confirmed at the next regular meeting of the lodge, other than one held directly after the Special General Meeting. However, before this can be done, the notice of motions has to be given in writing to the Secretary and read at the Regular Meeting previous to the Special General Meeting at which the motions are moved. The following notice of motions has been received by the Secretary and will be read at the meeting held on Wednesday, 9 November 2011.

<u>Title</u>: That the title of the by-laws be changed from "By-Laws of the Canberra Lodge of Research and Instruction" to "By-Laws of the Linford Lodge of Research".

<u>Clause 1(a)</u>: That the words "Canberra Lodge of Research and Instruction" be replaced by "Linford Lodge of Research".

Clause 2(a): That the words "especially new members" be deleted.

<u>Clause 3(a)</u>: That the words "be at the Masonic Centre, Barton," be deleted and replace by "held", and that "7.00 p.m." be replaced by "7.30 p.m.".

Clause 4 (a): That the words "two Assistant Preceptors," be deleted.

Clause 4(c): That this clause be deleted,

Clause 5(a): That "Except the Assistant Preceptors, the" be replaced by "The".

<u>Clause 5(b)</u>: That the words "other than that of an Assistant Preceptor," be deleted.

Clause 5(c): That this clause be deleted.

<u>Clause 12(a)</u>: That the words "at each Regular Meeting" be inserted after the words "accounts for payment" and the words "to date at each Regular Meeting" be replaced by the words "at the AGM in November".

<u>Clause 12(b)</u>: That the word "October" be replaced with "July" and the word "September" be replaced with "June".

<u>Clause 17(a)</u>: That the words "Special Meeting" be replaced by "Special General Meeting".

The purpose of these motions is to reflect the change in the name of the lodge, to remove the superfluous reference to "new members", to delete reference to the Masonic Centre, Barton as the place of meeting, to alter the starting time to reflect the time that we now meet, to delete references to Assistant Preceptors, to relieve the Treasurer of the necessity of submitting a financial statement for the year to date at each and every Regular Meeting, to change the financial year to run from July to the subsequent June, and to refer to a "Special Meeting" as a "Special General Meeting", for consistency.

The reason for deleting references to the Assistant Preceptors is because the lodge is a lodge of research rather than a lodge of research and instruction. While the name of the lodge included the word "instruction" in its name, it seemed sensible to include the DGIsW of the Canberra Districts as officers of the lodge, and they were Assistant Preceptors, *ex officio*. Now that the lodge is purely a research lodge, this requirement no longer holds.
