



One reply made the following comment: Just a reminder that, at least until the present GM goes out of office in August and probably after, we would need dispensation for any "esoteric" lecture and, if given, would undoubtedly contain the same restrictions as those given to Discovery, particularly that we could not advertise the meeting, admit any MM less that 3 years so, etc..

So, there is no consensus at present. Discussion of our choice of lecture is an item on the agenda for our April meeting. I have not given my input yet, although I suspect that I would have opted for Lecture 10 (Transpersonal Psychology and Free-Masonry) or Lecture 11 (Practice of Virtues: a Key for the Moral Evolution of the modern Free-mason). Before the April meeting, I will endeavour to map the lectures of the older list to those of the newer list. Other points that may be taken into consideration are that the Victorian Lodge of Research has chosen Lecture 2 (Isaac Newton and the Solomonic Temple) and the WM-elect of the Discovery Lodge of Research has suggested Lecture 2 (Isaac Newton and the Solomonic Temple) or Lecture 6 (XVIIIth Century Esoterism and Free-masonry) and pointed out that, as these papers are genuine and proper pieces of masonic research, it was probable that a dispensation could be obtained regarding any esoteric content. 
W BRO MICHEL JACCARD

W Bro Michel Jaccard is a successful scientist and engineer. He graduated in physics at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Lausanne in 1973 and was awarded a doctorate in biophysics in 1978. He also has a Master's degree in the biology of human nutrition from the Faculty of Medicine in Nancy and has undertaken a postgraduate executive management course.



He has been employed in various research, management and lecturing positions. As a Lecturer at the EPFL (École Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne) College of Management and Technology, he has been teaching Quality Management, performance and social responsibility since 2007. He was fully pensioned on 1 April, 2015.

Michel joined the Craft in 1971 and became a MM in 1975. His Mother Lodge is Liberté (in Lausanne, No. 21) of the Grand Lodge Alpina of Switzerland. He became WM of his lodge in 1985 and undertook the Higher Degrees of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite in 1986, of which he is now a 33° Mason. Michel is interested in masonic research and joined the Research Group of the Grand Loge Alpina of Switzerland soon after its creation and has been its President and Redactor in Chief of the magazine Masonica and is its current webmaster. He led the project to publish the "Guide of the Freemason", a textbook aimed to give a comprehensive information to Craft members on Freemasonry, first in French, then translated into German and Italian. Michel has published numerous research articles in Masonica, in the Alpina Magazine, and also in the Journals of the Research lodges of the Grande Loge de France and of the Grande Loge Nationale Française. He has given corresponding lectures.



The talk that Michel will be giving in Canberra on 1 October looks at Masonic improvement from a Jungian perspective. There is a book available for purchase for \$30 on the night. It includes the talk to be given in Canberra, as well an additional 15 papers, including one on the Swiss Grand Lodge Apina and its research group, others on various aspects of Freemasonry in Central Europe, one on Alchemy and Freemasonry, and others on Isaac Newton and Solomon's Temple, Indo-European influence on Freemasonry, Egyptomania and Freemasonry, René Guénon and Guénonism, Solomon, Magic and Freemasonry and the Tarot and two Swiss Freemasons.




