Training Day

- Lodge Federal Burrowa was successful in obtaining a promise of a \$10,000 interaction grant to match the \$10,000 they have already raised for a "soft fall" area at the Bunyip Pre School in Murrumburra. They have also organized a dinner at the local Golf Club, where they hope to raise an additional amount to add to that already obtained. Not bad, says the mRR Reg 10, V W Bro John Arthur, for a small town of 2,000 people
- Also approved was an application by CDMA for a \$1,000 grant for a "shelter/marquee" for St John Ambulance in Queanbeyan.

Also on Saturday 13 March, Lodge Truth of Braidwood got away to a good start in the Celebration of its 150

Canberra Masonic Centre (CMC) Sixth Floor Design Committee (SFDC)

The building was handed over to the CMC on Friday 26 February. The Board has appointed RW Bro Mike Dalton PJGW to head up the SFDC and recruit to it. This Committee is charged with making recommendations to the Board on fitout for the masonic floor. Board Chairman Greg Nason said that once the cornerstone tenant has been signed, the bank will release loan funds for the fitout.

Mike Dalton has established a small working group to get the ball rolling and he will be inviting qualified Masons to participate in all facets of the design. The First Bulletin and questionnaire from the Committee has been circulated to former tenants of the masonic floor.

Other Masonic Orders will be invited to a walkthrough to advise their requirements in terms of lighting, curtain anchor points and the like.

The fitout will be a complex task—both on design demands and on working within the budget. The budget will not only have to cover the bare bones of internal walls, ceilings and flooring; but also the decorations and furnishings for the lodge and other rooms; lighting; equipment (computers, audio visual; smart storage; kitchen etc); cabling and a host of other items.

This is a call to all Masons in Region 10. Do you have expertise in any of these areas and are you willing to

The 'Lone Pine' at Braidwood

This is a story about W Bro Ray Hasler—of Lodge Queanbeyan St Andrew 56—and his part in the story of the Lone Pine Tree at the Australian War Memorial (AWM). The Aleppo Pine (*Pinus halepensis*) in the Memorial's grounds



(pictured at left with Ray) was planted by HRH The Duke of Gloucester on 24 October 1934 and bears the following inscription:

After the capture of the Lone Pine ridge in Gallipoli (6 August 1915), an Australian Soldier who had taken part in the attack, in which his brother was killed. found a cone on one of the

branches used by the Turks as overhead cover for their trenches, and sent it to his mother. From seed shed by it she raised the tree, which she presented to be planted in the War Memorial grounds in honour of her own and others' sons who fell at Lone Pine.

According to the AWM, Lone Pine or Plateau 400 was the scene of a major diversionary offensive launched by the 1st Australian Infantry Division on 6 August 1915. The Turks had cut down all but one of the trees that cloaked the ridge to cover their trenches. The ridge dominated by the single Aleppo Pine became known as Lone Pine. In three days of fighting the Australians lost more than 2,000 men and the Turks losses were estimated at 7,000. Seven Victoria Crosses were awarded.

The Soldier who retrieved that pinecone was Lance Corporal Benjamin Smith. He was one of two Australian soldiers known to have souvenired pinecones. The other was Sgt Keith McDowell. The Smith pinecone propagated two seedlings—one which was presented to the town of Inverell NSW and the other to the Department of the Interior for planting in Canberra. The McDowell pinecone propagated four seedlings and all were planted in Victoria—one at Wattle Park in Melbourne, one at the Shrine of Remembrance in Melbourne, one at the Soldiers Memorial Club at The Sisters (near Terang) and the last at the Warrnambool Gardens.

Ray Hasler was a 13-year old Boy Scout from Braidwood when he attended the tree planting in 1934. As Ray recalls, "We travelled by bus and found ourselves at Parliament House about an hour and a half later; being a small part of a large crowd consisting of more Scouts from other areas, mounted Light Horse groups, Duntroon cadets and army personnel. After the official opening of Parliament by HRH Prince Henry, the Duke of Gloucester, all persons in uniform proceeded to walk down over Scott's Crossing towards an area near by the then proposed site for the War Memorial. Cars were not a common commodity in those days and so many civilians also walked. All persons assembled around the spot prepared for the small pine tree. There was the Duke together with about five other important people. One had a very shiny spade and handed it to the Duke. He then took a spade full of earth from the chosen spot and proceeded to place the Lone Pine Tree therein. He stood to attention and saluted whilst the other men raised their hats. A few words were then spoken, and as I recall, it sounded like it was being blessed."

Ray went on to enlist with the RAAF, serving from 1940 to 1945. He moved to Queanbeyan following his discharge, qualified as a carpenter and joiner and worked in the building trade until retirement.

A severe windstorm in September 2008 wreaked havoc on the Lone Pine tree, which lost a huge limb from its main trunk (pictured). Ray went out to inspect the damage the next



day and it was then that AWM staff discovered that he had attended the original planting ceremony.

Ray was subsequently invited to attend the 75th anniversary of the

planting and AWM senior historian Peter Burness presented him with a seedling from the tree. Ray then donated the seedling to the Palerang Council for planting at Braidwood.

Australian War Memorial

Needless to say Ray's offer was accepted and Braidwood turned on a fine and warm day for the

planting on Australia Day 2010. It was witnessed by members of the community and by a number of Masons from Braidwood, Queanbeyan and Canberra. The Mayor, Ald Walter Raynolds.



introduced Ray to the assembly and he was assisted in the planting by the Australia Day Ambassador to Palerang Council, the Olympic Swimming Champion Petria Thomas (all pictured at left). The Council will also erect a commemorative plaque at the site.

The final words belong with Ray, who said at the 75th anniversary, "I hope one day, when it's gone, like we all will be gone, they cut a section out of the butt of this tree and nominate what happened on each ring, each ring suggests a year of growth. There's 75 rings therein and they all tell a story, and it would be nice to read them."

Regional Grants 2010

- Lodge Caledonia of Canberra 938 is applying for an interAction grant of \$1,000 for *Darryl's Den*—a drop in centre operated by the National Brain Injury Foundation


The Brethren and their families from the Lodge of Truth will be making their annual pilgrimage to the evening race meeting of the Canberra Greyhounds on Sunday August 15.

TRAVELS IN MASONRY

Geoff Ludowyk PDGIW

One can join the Grand Master on his upcoming tour of the Holy Land; or embark on your own tour. There is a plan in gestation within my Lodge to visit Lodges in Malaysia and in India. Such travels will undoubtedly add to and enhance one's Masonic experience. In this article though I am alluding to the travels in Masonry beyond the Craft.

Some of you may know that I was recently appointed as District Grand Inspector of Workings for District G3 in the United Supreme Grand Chapter of Mark and Royal Arch Masons of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory. Quite a mouthful and usually abbreviated to USGC.

Having revealed my hand, I can say that there are a number of roads that a Mason can take for his travels in Masonry beyond the Craft. There is one road though that is first among equals.

The 8th of June 2005 was an historic day in the annals of Freemasonry in this jurisdiction. That evening the Grand Master signed a Concordat with the First Grand Principal of USGC. Paragraph 2 of the Concordat reads as follows:

Grand Lodge recognises the following degrees as worked by Chapters holding under the Grand Chapter:

- » Honourable Degree of Mark Master Mason (together with the associated Chair Degree being that of Worshipful Master of a Mark Lodge); and
- » Supreme Order of the Holy Royal Arch (consisting of the Holy Royal Arch Degree together with the associated Chair Degrees being those of Third Principal, Second Principal and First Principal of a Royal Arch Chapter)
- as forming part of Pure, Ancient Masonry and recommends that Brethren earnestly consider those degrees as ones which must be acquired as part of every Brother's progression in Freemasonry.

The salient points are that the Craft:

- » recognises that the Chapter offers degrees which are part of pure, Ancient Masonry; and
- » recommends those degrees as ones which must be acquired as part of every Brother's progression in Freemasonry.

Without giving away too much, it means that your journey into Pure, Ancient Masonry is not complete until you have received the Degrees of Mark Master Mason and the Holy Royal Arch.

In most other jurisdictions these degrees are administered by different Grand Bodies and a similar situation existed in NSW and the ACT until 18 October 1980. On that day the USGC was Consecrated and Dedicated when four Masonic Orders united:

- » Supreme Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New South Wales (Constituted 1889)
- » District Grand Scottish Royal Arch Chapter of New South Wales (Constituted 1863 and Holding under the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Scotland)
- » Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of New South Wales (Constituted 1889)
- » Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory (Constituted 1972).

The Consecrating First Grand Principal was Rt Hon The Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, KT, LL.D, JP, DL, MA—the First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Scotland.

The Installing First Grand Principal was M Em Comp George Alexander Shea OBE—the First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Western Australia.

USGC is headquartered at 23-25 New Canterbury Road Petersham NSW. The building is noted for its striking Egyptian Room (pictured) which originally formed part of the Royal Arch premises in College Street Sydney, until removed prior to the building's demolition in the late 1960s. It is a working Lodge and Chapter Room and in 1979 the present Egyptian Room was classified and registered by the National Trust and is maintained under the responsible and dedicated care of USGC.



Royal Arch Masonry is represented locally by three Chapters: two Canberra Chapters – Australia Mark and Royal Arch Chapter 28 and Caledonia Royal Arch Chapter 177; and St Andrew Queanbeyan Royal Arch Chapter 130. Chapter Australia works the NSW ritual and now meets at the Yass Masonic Centre, while both Caledonia and St Andrew work the Scottish ritual and meet at the Queanbeyan Masonic Centre. (Note: the different rituals arise from their antecedents prior to unification).

Known colloquially as 'Red Lodges' as its regalia is predominantly red in colour (contrast that with the 'Blue Lodges' of the Craft), membership of the Red is open to all Master Masons of two years standing.

The Concordat also introduced two initiatives. The first was the Ceremony of Mark Man, which can be worked by a Lodge or a Chapter. Lodge Capitol worked the second such Ceremony in this jurisdiction under my Mastership. Bro Lawrie Ludovici was the candidate and the second Mark Man – our Grand Master of that time (MW Bro Anthony Lauer) was the first. The Ceremony is intended to provide Master Masons with a glimpse into Royal Arch Masonry.

The second initiative was the provision for a Lodge to be linked with a Chapter under a licence granted by the Grand Master and the First Grand Principal. Effectively it means that a linked body would meet alternately as a Lodge and as a Chapter—remaining subject to and operating under the respective Constitutions—but operating administratively as a single entity.

To conclude, I ask all eligible Master Masons to seriously consider completing your journey in Pure, Ancient Masonry by applying to join one of your local Chapters. I can wholeheartedly recommend this step and in so doing, I am espousing the views of our Grand Lodge.


