IF we adopt this course of action, we need no new Licence from the Grand Master, or any other Constitutional change, as we would retain the old name and trade under the new one. We should, perhaps, amend our bylaws to reflect the new 'trading name', and a new logo would be nice.



# TALKING OF QC ...

QC's 'main objects were set out in Circular No. 7 dated January 1887.

- 1. To provide a centre and bond of union for Masonic Students.
- 2. To attract intelligent Masons to its meetings, in order to imbue them with a love for Masonic research.
- 3. To submit the discoveries or conclusions of students to the judgment and criticism of their fellows by means of papers read in Lodge.
- 4. To submit these communications and the discussions arising thereon to the general body of the Craft by publishing, at proper intervals, the Transactions of the Lodge in the entirety &to tabulate concisely, in the printed Transactions of the Lodge, the progress of the Craft throughout the World.
- 5. To make the English-speaking Craft acquainted with the progress of Masonic study abroad, by translations {in whole or part) of foreign works.
- 6. To reprint scarce and valuable works on Freemasonry, and to publish Manuscripts, etc.
- 7. To form a Masonic Library and Museum.
- 8. To acquire permanent London premises, and open a reading-room for the members.

In 2001 Gerry Cole was Preceptor, Tom Long and Frank Hull were the Deputies and the Assistant Preceptors [ie DGIsW] were Derek Robson and Bob Nairn. NWM was the Secretary/Treasurer.

### REBADGING THE LODGE

Even since its establishment our group has been hampered by its name.

Bob Linford, together with Sir Edwin Hicks [the then DGIW], wanted to start a 'standard' Lodge of Research, but GL wouldn't have a bar of a new Research Lodge in the jurisdiction. It was still recovering from having to withdraw, and later cancel, the warrant of the Sydney Lodge of Research in 1956-58.

A licence to conduct a Lodge of Instruction was the way that Bob saw as the way around this 'bottleneck'. The application for a licence, which included the words 'Research and' was approved by GM Beer and has been utilised ever since.

Bob was increasingly frustrated by the inclusion of 'Instruction' in both the name and the activities of CLORAI. From the1980s on, he steered the Lodge away from a 'split' format, to a purely research/education focus. I believe that local attitudes to an outside imposed regime of 'masonic instruction' have hardened even further since that time.

Those that have supported CLORAI over the past ten years have not seen the Lodge as having a role in instructional work. Neither have local Lodges.

Late last year I 'opened a dialogue' with RWBro Richard Dawes, the Chair of the Masonic Studies Committee of Grand Lodge. He has advised that we can 'rebrand' CLORAI as 'The Linford Lodge of Research'. Pat Linford has given her approval to the use of the name.
