

<u>Clause 3(a)</u>: That the words "be at the Masonic Centre, Barton," be deleted and replace by "held", and that "7.00 p.m." be replaced by "7.30 p.m.".

Clause 4 (a): That the words "two Assistant Preceptors," be deleted.

Clause 4(c): That this clause be deleted,

Clause 5(a): That "Except the Assistant Preceptors, the" be replaced by "The".

<u>Clause 5(b)</u>: That the words "other than that of an Assistant Preceptor," be deleted.

Clause 5(c): That this clause be deleted.

<u>Clause 12(a)</u>: That the words "at each Regular Meeting" be inserted after the words "accounts for payment" and the words "to date at each Regular Meeting" be replaced by the words "at the AGM in November".

<u>Clause 12(b</u>): That the word "October" be replaced with "July" and the word "September" be replaced with "June".







VW Bro Neil Morse is in the process of researching the history of the Sydney Lodge of Research, a lodge which existed between 1914 and 1956. His research is in preparation of the centenary of the formation of this Sydney Lodge of Research. Neil's talk will cover the history of the lodge and the resources to which he has had access. The Sydney Lodge of Research can be seen as the forerunner of the Research Lodge of NSW and the Discovery Lodge of Research. Those of you who have heard Neil speak before will know the thoroughness of Neil's researches and the enjoyment of attending to such well-prepared presentations and will no doubt try to be present at our July meeting. Those who have not are encouraged to attend for what should be an interesting evening.

OUR MAY MEETING

At our May meeting, we ratified the changes to our by-laws that had been previously passed. Your Secretary will bring a number of copies of the updated by-laws to the July meeting for distribution among those who would like a copy.

Also at the May meeting, as promised, those present answered a number of questions posed by Bro Jade Saunders, who was then an EAF, but who became a FCF last month. It was a very worthwhile exercise with both new Masons and longer established Masons enjoying answering as well as listening to a number of questions asked. We could well conduct a similar Q & A session sometime in the future. If so, we hope that the success of our May meeting will result in more relatively new Masons, as well as Masons of longer standing, sharing with us questions that they may have regarding Freemasonry.

THE DISCOVERY LODGE OF RESEARCH'S JULY MEETING

On Thursday, 5 July, the Discovery Lodge of Research will be holding its meeting at the Sydney Masonic Centre in Castlereagh Street, tyling at 7.30 pm. Your Preceptor, who is also the Secretary of the Discovery Lodge of Research, VW Bro Neil Morse, and your Secretary, VW Bro David Slater, will both be attending this meeting of the Discovery Lodge. There are a few spare seats in their cars. If you would like to attend, please contact them. Their contact details appear on the last page of this notice paper.

The main work for the evening is a paper to be given by Bro Bob James entitled "Freemasonry as a Crime Scene". Bob will be looking at the kind of research we Masons undertake. He sees us as not always taking context into consideration. He presents two methods of preparation and response, which he names the Moses and Socrates methods. He prefers the latter but feels that Masons often undertake the former.

There will also be a talk by RW Bro Andrew S Brown, whom the Grand Master has appointed as the first Governor of the proposed College of Masonic Studies. He will briefly address the Discovery Lodge on why the College will come into being, what it will be intending to achieve, how it plans to do this, and how he and the College Board see its rôle. RW Bro Andrew S Brown has indicated that he will be happy to take questions.

THE COLLEGE OF MASONIC STUDIES

As background, the formation of the College of Masonic Studies was announced by the Grand Master at the June Quarterly Communication.

The Grand Master sees the College as a source of instruction and enlightenment for willing brethren. He states that it is a response to the many young men who have joined lodges in recent years and have displayed an interest in learning about the history, philosophy and symbolism of the Craft. The Grand Master sees the task of the College of Masonic Studies as fulfilling the needs resulting from the spirit of enquiry of these young men.

The College will have its own board, chaired by a Governor (the above mentioned RW Bro Andrew S Brown), which will be responsible to the Executive Council. The College Board will guide the general policies of the Executive Council and oversee the broad outlines of the curriculum. A Dean will also be appointed, viz. W Bro Andrew St J Brown (not to be confused with RW Bro Andrew S Brown, especially as W Bro Andrew St J Brown is soon to be promoted to representative rank). So that all members of our jurisdiction can benefit from the College, distant learning methods will be emphasised, although there may be some face-to-face programmes. The Board of the College will be authorised to award appropriate recognition to successful students and it will also be authorised to levy suitable student fees.



VW Bro David Slater will talk on possible masonic influences of Freemasonry on the Vietnamese Cao Đài religion.

As can be seen from the accompanying photograph that David took at Tây Ninh, there are some common motifs

Caodaism was founded in the 1920s in Cochinchina (now southern Vietnam)



when it was a French colony. At this time there were two lodges in Sài Gòn owing allegiance to the Grand Orient de France and one to the Grande Loge de France. Are these common motifs significant or are they just coincidental?

OUR JULY MEETING

At our July meeting our Preceptor, VW Bro Neil Morse, gave a talk on his researches into the history of the Sydney Lodge of Research, which was founded in 1914 and ceased its existence in 1956. Neil gave a summary of where he was at, regarding his research into this lodge, how and why it was formed and some of the reasons for its demise. The Sydney Lodge of Research is a predecessor to the Research Lodge of New South Wales and the Discovery Lodge of Research, and has a significant place in the history of masonic research in our jurisdiction. Neil intends to have his history of this lodge completed by the centenary of its formation, that is, in two years' time. Again, Neil showed us how research should be undertaken, where possible, by referring to primary sources, and we thank Neil for his interesting and informative talk.



VW Bro Neil Morse will give a presentation on the National Library of Australia's MS1097/44 - Cayers Maçonique, Tome 1 ("an illustrated 18th century French manuscript relating to Freemasonry"), part of the Clifford Collection.

This should be an interesting talk. Neil has spent a lot of time researching the Clifford Collection. His 2000 Kellerman Lecture was entitled "The Degrees of the Practical Masons". Before this, Neil gave a talk on the rituals contained in the Cayers Maçonique manuscript at on at the Victorian Lodge of Research on 28 June 1997. This was ground breaking research and we are indeed fortunate that Neil has decided to give this presentation to us this month.



The Lodge usually meets on the **second Wednesday** of February, April, May, July, August, October and November.

This next meeting being our Annual General Meeting, there are no scheduled research presentations. The business of the meeting will be to have the audited annual statement of accounts presented by the Treasurer and the conducting of the election of officers for the 2012-2013 year. However, there should be some expectation that those who attended the ANZMRC 2012 Conference meeting in Wellington, New Zealand, will be willing to share their conference experiences at this meeting.

Usually, after the formal proceedings of our AGMs have been completed, we celebrate the end of the year with fruit cake and port, inter alia. There is no reason why the same will not occur this year, particularly as the deferment of the AGM brings us closer to the festive season. Any contributions of food and drink would be appreciated.

OUR OCTOBER MEETING

At our October meeting, VW Bro Neil Morse gave a presentation on the National Library of Australia's (NLA) MS1097/44 - Cayers Maçonique, Tome 1, "an illustrated 18th century French manuscript relating to Freemasonry". He related how, in 1991, W Bro Ian Main came across this work whilst chasing up some aspects of his family history in the NLA's Clifford Collection, a collection of many books, primarily relating to the lives and works of the Clifford family of Chudleigh in Devon, England. I mentioned that Neil had made reference to Ian to Ian's widow, Jean, at the recent funeral of W Bro Colin Norris. She was delighted and well remembered the circumstances relating to Ian's discovery of the Cayers Maçonique.

In 1993 RW Bro Bob Linford, after whom our lodge is named, passed on to Neil the first three degrees contained in the Cayers Maçonique, with the suggestion that Neil may wish to translate them from French to English and conduct some research concerning them. Neil undertook the former task, with the help of a French-English dictionary and various rituals of the period. The latter task resulted in his ascertaining that the NLA volume is the first in a set of six volumes, the other five now being housed in the Kloss collection at the Library of the Grand Orient of the Netherlands in the Hague. It is not known how the first volume became part of the Clifford Collection. It would appear that these volumes were written in the latter half of the 18tth century, more specifically between 1782 and 1789.

Neil found out the value of the volume belonging to the NLA when an offer of purchase was made by the owners of the other five volumes. Neil's reply was that the first volume belonged to the people of Australia and that he was not able to sell it, even if he wished to do so.

Neil then described the various rituals contained in the Cayers Maçonique collection. For information on these rituals, I refer you to two papers previously presented by Neil. On 28 June 1997, Neil presented a paper at the Victorian Lodge of Research, No. 218. The title of his paper is *The First Three Degrees of the French ("Clifford") Rituals*. This paper appears in the 1997 transactions of that lodge, entitled *Examining Freemasonry*. An abridged version can be found at http://www.lodgeofresearch.com/cliffordRituals.html. Neil's Kellerman Lecture, delivered at the 5th Biennial ANZMRC Conference held in Brisbane in August 2000, is entitled *The Degrees of the Practical Mason*. In this paper Neil introduces a series of two rituals, viz. *Grade d'app Maçon de practique* and *Grade de Comp Maçon de practique*.
