LAST MONTH'S MEETING

Last month, VW Bro Neil Morse spoke on James Squire Farnell (JSF). Neil has submitted the following summary of and supplement to this talk: Like many pioneers, JSF is mainly forgotten these days. Partly because he had the misfortune to die at an inopportune time, and partly because, as is also still common, he was 'an inconvenient truth'. In fact, the first official activity of the United Grand Lodge of New South Wales was to hold a lodge of sorrow for JSF. This would have stuck in some people's craw. The only parallel in Australian Freemasonry to JSF is Coppin in Victoria. The basics of JSF's life story can be read in the ADB entry [http://adb.anu.edu.au/biography/farnell-james-squire-3499] and the political focus is dealt with in Frank Bongiorno's chapter, 'James Squire Farnell', in David Clune and Ken Turner (ed.), *The Premiers of New South Wales 1856-2005*, The Federation Press, Sydney, pp. 139-151. A short piece on his copy of the GLI 1858 Constitutions will appear in this journal shortly.





If you have not as yet registered, don't forget to do so for the ANZMRC Biennial Conference, to be held this year in Cairns, Far North Queensland from Thursday, 28 August to Sunday, 31 August.

OUR MAY MEETING

At our May meeting, VW Bro David Slater spoke about the First Artificer in Metals mentioned in Holy Writ, but he spent too much time relating the story depicted in Darren Aronofsky's film *Noah* and *The Temple Legend*, as described by Rudolf Steiner, so much so that one brother implied that it looked as though David had partaken of some hallucinatory substance.

The talk could have been much better prepared, in which case the point that this First Artificer's being the ancestor of the Principal Architect of King Solomon's Temple may be the reason for his significance in our Third Degree ritual. The Temple Legend, as described in Steiner's Lecture 7, given in Berlin on 2 December, 1904, has Solomon being jealous of Balkis, the Queen of Sheba's attraction to the Principal Architect. This resulted in Solomon's disinterest in what the ruffians did to the Principal Architect. When the ruffians had caused the Molten Sea of the Temple to flow over the surroundings instead of remaining in a rigid form, the Principal Architect heard a voice ordering him to plunge into the Molten Sea, which he did. He sank even further so that he eventually reached the centre of the earth where he encountered his ancestors, the First Artificer and, further back in his family tree, Cain. The former gave the Principal Architect a magic hammer which enabled him to restore all things to their proper order. Later, the Principal Architect married the Queen of Sheba and was unable to avert the wrath of Solomon and the revenge of the three ruffians; they murdered him.

Of course, this is just a legend, but so is the story relayed to us in our ritual. But it is interesting that the First Artificer and the Principal Architect being related may explain the appearance of the First Artificer in the Third Degree.



Of note is the annual Esoteric Seminar sponsored by the Masonic Education Committee of the Grand Lodge of Connecticut. The third annual seminar was held on 26

July this year and it had the theme "Freemasonry: a deeper dive". For those who are missing the opportunity to openly study and talk about such matters, one possibility would be to attend their next seminar in late July 2015. This year, for \$25, those attending were able to attend a number of presentations, as well as being given lunch and a DVD of the previous year's seminar.

The conference was opened by the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Connecticut, MW Bro Simon LaPlace, and the keynote speaker was Bro Timothy Hogan, a practising alchemist form Colorado. It is of interest that

he has lectured in masonic lodges "in every continent except Antarctica and Australia". He has written a number of books including (1) *The Alchemical Keys to Masonic Ritual*, (2) *The 32 Secret Paths of Solomon: a new examination of the Qabbalah in Freemasonry*, (3) *Revelation of the Holy Grail* (written under the name Chevalier Emerys), and (4) *Novo Clavis Esoterika*.

Streeter (Massachusetts), A Point Within a Circle: Masonic Lessons of Human Geometry by Elliot Chikofsky (Massachusetts), Three Degrees— Four Worlds: The Renaissance Worldview of Masonry by Kirk White (Vermont), Pythagorean Number Symbolism by Chris Murphy (Vermont), Esoteric Freemasonry and the Magic System of the Golden Dawn by William Mackey (Connecticut), Psalm 133: Hidden Connections and Revealed Meaning by Elliot Chikofsky (Massachusetts) and The Chamber of Reflection by Justin Duffy (Connecticut).

If next year a DVD of this year's seminar is given to those who attend, then this alone could make attendance at the 2015 seminar worthwhile, let alone the papers that will be presented next year.



As this is the last meeting for the year, port and fruit cake are usually available for consumption, amongst other drinks and food.

OUR AUGUST MEETING

In August, VW Bro Neil Morse spoke on the "4th ABGROC and its Masons". As suggested in the notice paper for that evening, ABGROC does stand for "Australian Broad Gauge Railway Operating Company". My other suggestion regarding Marshal Foch was wrong, although I was mislead by being informed that the event took place on 25 rather than 27 November 2018. A summary of the talk, provided to me by Neil, follows:

4ABGROC stands for the Fourth Australian Broad Gauge Railway Operating Company. The first of the Railway Operating Companies were raised in April 1915 and deployed to France in June of that year. They performed three basic functions:

- 1. the management of railway traffic,
- 2. the provision of crews for locomotives, and
- 3. the repair of rolling stock and other items needed to keep a railway in operation.

The Railway Operating Companies were exclusively concerned with the operation of full-size ('standard gauge') trains. The operation of light railways was the responsibility of the Light Railway Companies.

On 27 November 1918 a group of Masons held a masonic 'social' to celebrate the Armistice and, to commemorate the occasion, they produced a brochure. It named all present, and also listed those who had apologised for non-attendance. Military ranks and units, as well as masonic ranks and affiliations, were listed.

The brochure read:

After being together for nearly two years, and after several unsuccessful attempts, due to active service conditions, the masonic Brethren of the 4th Australian Broad Gauge Railway Operating Company, A.I.F., met [at] a social evening, somewhere in France, on 27th November, 1918, in the old city of "Dreadful Nights", in which the Company was stationed. They received the right good hand of fellowship from the French brethren, obtaining the use of their little Masonic Hall, showing plainly the scars of war.

The tables were laid down the centre of the hall, and, under the Chairmanship of Worshipful Brother Captain J. M. Bygott, a goodly number of Brethren sat down.

The usual toasts were honoured, as of yore, and in peace, love, and harmony, several enjoyable hours were spent.

The 'somewhere in France' or 'old City of "Dreadful Nights" ' was Dunkerque.

This meeting is important because it was one of a very few AIF masonic meetings held whilst on active service during the Kaiser's War.


